







### "What's Up Doc?" Will a carrot a day keep the Dr away?

**9thTable Topic Speaker** was **Barbara Beveridge** with her question "What is your worst medical injury?" **Spasmodic Torticollis** a/k/a Cervical Dystonia is a neurological disorder affecting the muscles of the neck which cause the head to be pulled either sideways, a painful condition.



Nirish Shakya then said that some great blogs have been written by the Club Twits.


