With 'Leadership Lessons That I Learnt', Demian Coorey presented a fascinating final speech for his 'High Performance Leadership' and ALS Award. His project was to develop a new Advanced Manual of five assignments to be used for training by an Advanced Club.

He found that to learn new leadership & communication skills, he had to 'think outside the square' and place tough constraints on himself: 1. Every member of his team would come from the one club. 2. No meetings except the kickoff meeting. 3. He would do no work, everything would be done by others. (All definite signs of a great leader). It was an invaluable lesson in doing something where 'cost is zero yet the problems are real'. Isn't that what Toastmasters is all about?



How does one overcome the fear of swimming, especially if it freaks you out? How about Scuba Diving . . . on one's Honeymoon? That's exactly

what Ron did, or rather his wife planned for him. We learnt from his Inspirational speech 'All Wet' a tale of his trip to Fiji. At school swimming lessons he wasn't even a dolphin or a tadpole.

Even later at high school, his PE teacher took pity on him and gave him a kick board. Moral of his tale: doesn't matter if you have fear of water or jumping from planes or public speaking, challenging yourself is the only way to overcome it.



In his usual energetic & interactive style, Steven Cox gave a dynamic presentation on 'Creativity and Communication' from the Interpersonal Communication Advanced Manual. He demonstrated some useful everyday conversation techniques by initiating a conversation with partner guest speaker Larrisa, who deliberately or otherwise made sure that Steven's skills were tested to the full.

The key to successful conversation, is to ask open ended questions like what, how and why to get people talking openly. His evaluator Malkit, recommended that Steven give the same presentation in a pub or club, and watch how all the girls come after him!

Next speaker Robert T educated us on 'Alzheimer's and Other Diseases'. a 'Research your Topic' CC manual speech. We heard a passionate story about his father's disability overall. Around 900.000 motorbike with his son in the open.
