Club Mission

We provide a supportive and positive learning experience in which members are empowered to develop communication and leadership skills, resulting in greater selfconfidence and personal growth. Our first official meeting of the new executive year was themed "What's your dream". Speaking to theme John Taylor told us about his dreams – did you know that when John was younger that he wanted to become a motor mechanic and how this deviated to being a TV mechanic. He then posed five questions which were posed to two different people at a time. Question 1: As a child what was your dream job? Question 2: Do dreams come true? Alicia Leise Question 3: What is your craziest dream? Question 4: Are you currently in your dream job and it not what would you like to do? Question 5: if you had a dream about toastmasters what it would be about?

We had five prepared speeches Peter Steinhour started us off with an Icebreaker where he told us about how he was dying—dying to leave school that is and his journey that he has been on since finishing school. Anu Vijayan brought us back to her childhood with vivid descriptions of where she grew up and told us about how her love of birds then has inspired her to pursue conservation work. Christine Huynh presented a speech with a moral and Michael Said presented a beautiful tribute to his late father Noel. Andrew Emerson presented a speech Onomastics! A wonderfully researched piece which had all of us thinking! If you missed it you can read it below!

Speech-Onomastics Andrew Emerson

What is the one thing that you own, that will always be used by someone else? No its not your wallet, it's something even closer to home-Your name. Mr.Toastmaster, ladies and gentleman today I will be talking about onomastics which is the study of names and how it has an impact on our day to day lives.

The word name is derived from a variety of languages from the Old English word nama, the German namo, the Persian nam and the Tamil namam. In fact the word name in a variety of languages sound similar, and have been used for thousands of centuries to identify people, places and possessions. A personal name is one or more words used to identify you, usually consisting of your first name used as the personal identifier and your surname often shared by members of the same family in many cultures. In many lucky individuals around this table, you may even have one or more middle names. But did you know each of your individual names actually has a meaning? For example did you know that Vivek's surname, Singhal is derived from the Hindi word for lion, Christine's surname Huynh is the Vietnamese word for gold, or Vicki's surname Sheehan is the Irish word for peace. Or how about Ron. While Marriot may also be the largest hotel chain in the US, it is the medieval name for Marie which when translated means rebellion.

The names of places also have a symbolic meaning. For example did you know that the street name of our club, Macquarie Street is named because of the Macquarie River. Or our very own club name Parramatta is derived from the Indigenous word for the place of the eels. Many of you have been eating fish tonight, but in reality you should be asking yourselves have you been served eel. In fact have you wondered why roads are sometimes called streets. This naming convention started in Manhattan where roads that crossed from east to west were called streets and those that crossed north to south avenues.

The names of possessions often play an important role in our lives. For example a car's name whether it be a BMW,Lambourghini or Hyundai can be the difference between paying \$20,000 or \$100,000. A hotel's name such as Budget Hotel or the Hilton can influence whether it is busy or empty. Even a toastmasters club name ...such as Parramatta or (another club) can influence whether we are good or simply the best.

As one proverb put it a good name is better than great riches. So the next time someone says the word onomastics, just remember that there is more to a name than just a badge.
